



This year's fair is larger than ever. Back for our third outing, the marquee has been expanded and we are pleased to welcome back our previous exhibitors as well as some newcomers, offering an even wider choice for visitors: BBC Antiques Roadshow clock expert, **Richard Price**, who deals in French Louis XVI and Empire timepieces, as well as more unusual clocks, automata and related items; **Jupiter Antiques** bringing English and Continental porcelain by Sevres, Royal Crown Derby, Worcester, Spode, Paris and 18th century Meissen pieces; **Ottocento**, dealers in Old Masters, 19th century and early 20th century European paintings, posters and prints; **The Parker Gallery Ltd**, dealers and agents in Old Master & British paintings, offering paintings and drawings from a broad range of periods and schools, and recently hit the headlines when offering an unidentified, deaccessioned George Stubbs' painting for sale at BADA 2017; **Morgan Strickland Decorative Arts** specialists in Art Nouveau, Arts & Crafts, Aesthetic Movement, Art Deco and twentieth century design and **Lucy B Campbell Gallery** that focuses on British and international contemporary artists, introducing many who have since become highly regarded and sought after, so here is your chance to make your own discoveries.





At our Harewood event, the majority of the expert dealers are returning exhibitors, keen to offer for sale their latest high quality stock. A number of items of local Yorkshire interest can be found amongst the eclectic mix on offer this year, including Spode porcelain with a hand-painted view of York Minster amongst the ceramics to be found on Carolyn Stoddart-Scott's stand; antique maps of Yorkshire and elsewhere from J Dickinson Maps and Prints; and from first time exhibitor, Mary Cooke Antiques, some exceptional and rare York silver.



Nearly a year ago, we announced an alliance with the Queen Elizabeth Scholarship Trust (QEST), the charitable arm of the Royal Warrant Holders Association. This organisation is at the forefront of promoting education and excellence in craft in the UK. At most of our fairs, we have one or more QEST scholar attending and demonstrating their skills. This is an opportunity for you to talk to and learn more and maybe even commission or purchase from a dedicated craftsperson.


At Harewood, we are welcoming two Yorkshire based QEST scholars this May: Teresa Dybisz, a stone carver and sculptor, who undertakes commissions for architectural and figurative stonework and lettering. Her proposal for a grottesque above a doorway to the entrance of St. George's Chapel at Windsor Castle was accepted after undergoing a rigorous selection process. Teresa is joined by sculptor Andrian Melka, who moved to England from Albania with a Getty scholarship. His commissions in the UK and America include work on the Jubilee Fountain on the Sandringham Estate erected to commemorate Her Majesty The Queen's Golden Jubilee and figures of Christ and Madonna for St Mungo's Church in Glasgow.

At our Petworth Park event, we are also supporting the David Shepherd Wildlife Foundation. It is a small, highly effective wildlife conservation charity funding key conservation projects across Africa and Asia that protect endangered species, founded by the wildlife artist David Shepherd. The charity's mission is to increase awareness to people around the world about the need to protect and conserve wild animals and their habitats. They fund projects that fight wildlife crime, protect natural areas and engage local communities in finding long-term, sustainable solutions to protect their native wildlife. They also campaign for stronger laws and protectionist policies for wildlife and fund investigations to expose the illegal trade in endangered species. Money raised at The Petworth Park Antiques & Fine Art Fair will help them protect key species including elephants, rhinos, tigers, pangolins, painted dogs and snow leopards.

REFRESHMENTS


All our events offer light refreshments within the fair. Both the mansion at Petworth and Harewood House offer their own catering alternatives without you even having to leave the area.
